- The Ice Age Trail is one of the 11 National Scenic Trails
- It is all in Wisconsin
- www.iceagetrail.org states "More than 12,000 years ago, an immense flow of glacial ice sculpted a landscape of remarkable beauty across Wisconsin. As the glacier retreated, it left behind a variety of unique landscape features. These glacial remnants are now considered among the world's finest examples of how continental glaciation sculpts our planet."
- How did you enjoy your time there?
- I assume "Glacial Gear" got its name from the Glacier aspects of the Ice Age Trail?

History of the Company

- You get out there and you have so much time to ponder and to think about everything and one of those things is "what would make my life easier and better right now?"
- Then you come up with something and run with it.

The birth of the trail rag...

- I carry this everywhere
- If there is one thing I do, no matter what they weather...I SWEAT.
- I am always having to wipe my face, my nose or whatever
- Having a trail rag has been a life saver for me.
- I never leave home without it.

When did you know this would be a business that you wanted to get into?

- What was the moment for you?
- Had you ever thought of doing that before that moment?

How did you decide to branch out and make more items?

- Was it an easy transition?
- I love that there are so many stories like yours
- Where you were originally outdoors people and you figured out something you needed
- But not only something YOU needed but something that would benefit others as well

• And you turned it into a nice small business that not only provides you with income but helps everyone have a more pleasant experience.

Now you offer several items...

- Blankets
- Sleeping bag liners
- Gaiters
- Hats
- Beanies

So...let's talk about **Your Material**...

- Talk about Merino Wool
- The specific kind you use and WHY?

Characteristics of Merino Wool

- <u>WARM</u>: Wool is a great insulator, as the fiber's natural crimp, the waviness of the wool fiber, traps pockets of air, which provides resistance against cold temperatures.
- <u>WATER RETENTION</u>: Merino wool is absorbent and can absorb up to 30 percent of its weight in water before it feels wet.
- <u>DURABLE</u>: As a natural fiber, merino wool is inherently very strong, as the individual fibers interlock as a result of the protein structure. The fiber's natural crimp also adds elasticity and strength.
- <u>BREATHABLE</u>: Merino wool has great breathability because the wool is able to absorb and evaporate moisture. Because of its breathable nature, merino is a great fiber for regulating body temperature making it a perfect base layer for outdoor activities.
- <u>COOLING</u>: Merino wool stores moisture in its fibers. As that moisture evaporates, it creates a natural cooling mechanism and helps regulate body heat.
- MOISTURE-WICKING: Like some synthetic fibers, merino wool also has the ability to wick moisture away from the skin. This is because of the wool's amazing absorption and breathable qualities.
- <u>SOFT</u>: Since merino wool fibers are finer than any other sheep fibers, they are extremely soft to the touch.
- <u>ODOR-RESISTANT</u>: Merino wool has antimicrobial properties, as the natural lanolin in the sheep's wool repels odor-causing bacteria. Since merino wool manages moisture so well, there is no wet environment for that bacteria to grow.

Washing Instructions

What is the best way to clean the wool items?

- After weeks of hiking and an occasional dip in the nearest creek, use a mild (preferably wool) detergent with your machine set to hand wash.
- Lay flat to dry. (Hanging completely wet woolens to dry is not advised-this may result in stretching out of shape)
